

Introducing Teaching School Hubs

The national network of around 750 teaching schools has been replaced by a new model of teaching school hubs. 87 hubs cover the whole of England and the focus on the most important aspect of school improvement: teacher development. In May 2021, Sir Nick Gibb wrote to all schools encouraging them to contact and work closely with the teaching school hub designated to support all schools, regardless of type or phase, in their region. Bradford Teaching School Hub, led by Copthorne Primary School and part of Exceed Academies Trust, serves Bradford and the hub's formal partner schools beyond the district. From Autumn 2021, Bradford Teaching School Hub will support the growth of the next

schools via its partnership with Ambition Institute. It will provide a school-led Appropriate Body service for the induction and assessment of early career teachers in the first and second year of induction. Again in partnership with Ambition Institute, Bradford Teaching School Hub will deliver the full suite of National Professional Qualifications, including the three reformed leadership NPQs and three new specialist NPQs: leading teacher development (scholarship funding anticipated); leading teaching; and leading culture and behaviour. In addition, it will offer 'other' high-quality professional development. In 2021-22 this will focus on culture and coaching. Coaching is the backbone of school improvement.

Early Career Teachers programme

Schools have a statutory duty to provide an Early Career Framework-based two-year induction for early career teachers from September 2021. There are three option for school to consider but the ECF Full Induction Programme option is the one recommended and encouraged by government and they option they provide full funding for. The *Early Career Teachers* programme delivered by Bradford Teaching School Hub in partnership with <u>Ambition Institute</u> - delivered by local teachers and school leaders - is available to all



funding, e.g. your Appropriate Body will need to undertake fidelity checks and regular core checks based on extensive planning materials submitted by the school. Statutory induction

Induction has changed. The key change is that it has become a twoyear process rather than one. All schools employing an early career teacher from September 2021 will be required to submit annual assessments to the Appropriate Body and progress reviews when a teacher is not on track to successfully complete induction.
