Follow-up to letter to schools from Rt Hon Nick Gibb MP (June 2020)

Following the recent Minister for School Standards' letter to all school dated June 2020, I thought you would appreciate localised information relating to the teacher development reforms the Minister outlined. I will respond to each of the themes covered in the Minister's letter and signpost you to the teacher development support available via Bradford Teaching School Hub – the DfE accredited partnership led by Copthorne Primary School and Exceed Academies Trust to support all schools, regardless of phase or type, in Bradford and our partners beyond the district. As the letter states, teaching school hubs are the "backbone" of the teacher development reforms and the easiest way to sign-up to these programmes is via Bradford Teaching School Hub.

Early Career Framework (ECF)

Schools must provide a two-year Early Career Framework-based induction for Early Career Teachers from September 2021. The Full Induction Programme option is the DfE's recommended route for schools to take, and this provides schools with the greatest levels of support and funding to schools. There are also fewer fidelity and induction checks associated with this choice.

Following a rigorous due diligence process, Bradford Teaching School Hub has chosen to become a delivery partner to Ambition Institute to offer the *Early Career Teachers* programme. We are excited to be delivering this high-quality, fully funded programme which prioritises coaching support for Early Career Teachers (ECTs) and Mentors within a flexible delivery model.

Appropriate Body

Schools must subscribe to an Appropriate Body service for the induction of Early Career Teachers. Bradford Teaching School Hub provides a school-led Appropriate Body service. National Professional Qualifications (NPQs)

The NPQs available in the autumn 2021 consist of three new specialist NPQs and three reformed leadership NPQs. The specialist NPQs replace the National Professional Qualification for Middle Leaders. These are the National Professional Qualifications for Leading Teacher Development, Leading Teaching, and Leading Behaviour and Culture.

The reformed National Professional Qualifications for Executive Leadership, Headship, and Senior Leaders will also be available. There will also be a NPQH Additional Support Offer for headteachers in the first two-years in post.

The DfE have announced significant scholarship funding for these programmes, but we are still awaiting eligibility criteria to be confirmed. The first programmes will commence in November 2021.

Again, following a rigorous due diligence process, Bradford Teaching School Hub has chosen to become a delivery partner to Ambition Institute to offer the suite of National Professional Qualifications.
